Ingo R. Mainert is Managing Director and CIO Multi Asset Europe at Allianz Global Investors. He is a member of the management board of Allianz Global Investors GmbH.

He started his professional career in 1988 at Commerzbank AG, where, following a traineeship in securities, he became a stock market analyst and economics consultant for interest rates and currencies. He then took on various tasks in asset management, such as Chief Economist and Head of Portfolio Management Balanced. From 2004 to 2008 he was Head of Portfolio Management Private Banking. At the same time, from 2006 he was responsible for the entire portfolio management of cominvest as CIO, which was merged into Allianz Global Investors in 2009 during the takeover of Dresdner Bank by Commerzbank.

Ingo Mainert studied business administration at the University of Frankfurt. He has a degree in business administration and is a certified investment analyst (DVFA). As Deputy CEO, he represents the German Association for Financial Analysis and Asset Management (DVFA). He is also a part of the Issuer Market Advisory Committee (IMAC) of Deutsche Börse AG and on the Board of Trustees of the Institute for Banking and Financial History (IBF).

From 2010 to 2013 he was a member of the Foundation Council of the Beilstein-Institut zur Förderung der Chemischen Wissenschaften. From July 2017 to June 2021 a honorary associate member of the Objections Committee at Federal Financial Supervisory Authority (Bundesanstalt für Finanzdienstleistungsaufsicht—BaFin). From July 2020 to May 2023 a board member of the International Capital Market Association (ICMA) and from January 2013 to December 2023 a member of the Bond Market Contact Group (BMCG) of the European Central Bank (ECB) for the efama (European Fund and Asset Management Association).

He did his almost 10-year alternative civilian service as a volunteer in civil and disaster control at the Federal Agency for Technical Relief (THW).
